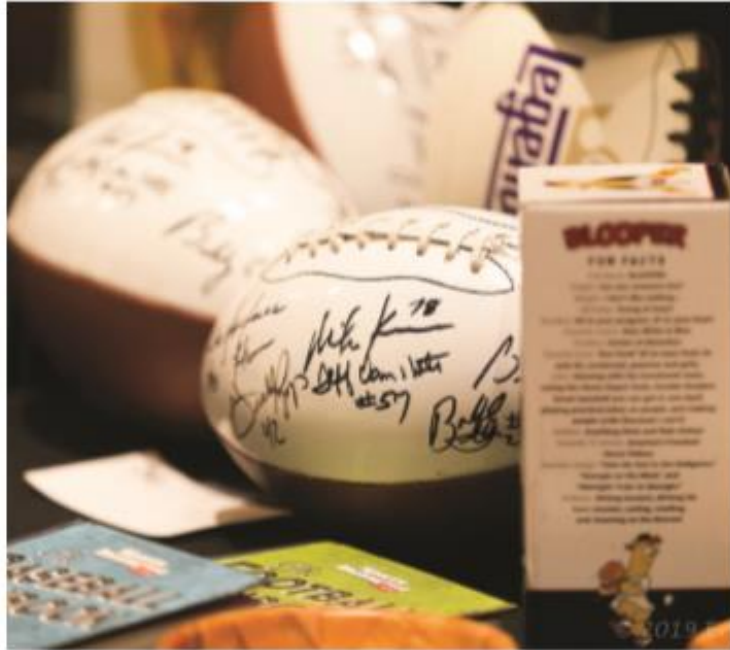

2020 INDUCTEES



MORTEN ANDERSEN

Morten played 25 seasons in the NFL, 8 with the Atlanta Falcons (1995-2000, and 2006-2007). He is the all-time NFL leader in games played with 382. In December 1995 against the New Orleans Saints, he became the first player in NFL history to kick three field goals of over 50 yards in a single game. Best remembered as kicking the game-winning field goal in overtime in the 1998 NFC Championship Game to beat the Minnesota Vikings and send the Falcons to their first-ever Super Bowl appearance. Member of Pro Football Hall of Fame.



CALVIN JOHNSON

Calvin was a letterman in football and baseball at Sandy Creek High School in Tyrone, Georgia. Calvin then went to Georgia Tech (2004-2006) and made a case for being the greatest Georgia Tech player of all time. Johnson had 178 receptions in his career, good for 2,927 yards and 28 touchdowns. He ranks first in Tech history in career receiving yards, second in receptions, first in touchdown receptions, and first in career 100-yard receiving games with 13. He is widely regarded as one of the greatest NFL wide receivers of all time despite his early retirement at age 30 in 2016.



DIKEMBE MUTUMBO

Dikembe is regarded as one of the greatest NBA shot blockers and defensive players of all time, winning the NBA Defensive Player of the Year Award four times; he was also an eight-time NBA All-Star. In his 5 years (1996-2001) with the Atlanta Hawks, he led Atlanta to back-to-back 50+-win seasons in 1996-97 (56-26) and 1997-98 (50-32). Known for offering up his signature finger wag after an emphatic denial of another dunk attempt. His number 55 is retired by the Hawks. Inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2015.

2020 INDUCTEES



GARLAND PINHOLSTER

Garland most notably coached at Oglethorpe University from 1956 to 1966 and compiled a 181–67 record as their basketball coach. Won the Georgia Interscholastic Athletic Conference championship four straight years. His Stormy Petrels, were invited to the NCAA tournament in 1963, and reached the semi-finals. Garland's coaching career also includes coaching the United States to a gold medal in the 1963 Pan American games. He was a driving force in the Atlanta Tipoff Club and helped start the Naismith Award.



GARY STOKAN

Gary is CEO and president of Peach Bowl, Inc., a position he has held since 1998. Under his leadership, Peach Bowl, Inc. events have generated an economic impact of over \$1.08 billion in direct government tax revenue for the city of Atlanta since 1999. As president of the Atlanta Sports Council (from 1998-2009), Gary led Atlanta's efforts to brand the city as the "Sports Capital of the World". Additionally, Stokan's vision and leadership efforts resulted in the relocation of the College Football Hall of Fame to Atlanta and the creation of Atlanta Hall Management, Inc.



MARGARET MATTHEWS WILBURN

The native Atlantan went to Atlanta Public Schools David T. Howard High School where she was twice the Georgia State High School Track Champion in the long jump (in 1952 and 1953). She then became captain of the famed Tennessee State University's "Tigerbells". Margaret captured the bronze medal in the 1956 Melbourne Olympics in the 4 × 100 meters with three of her U.S. teammates. She was the first American woman to leap a record 20 feet in the long jump. She won a silver medal in the long jump at the 1959 Pan American Games.
